



# Human Rights and Nursing Awards

The Human Rights and Nursing Award, which is run through the *Nursing Ethics* journal, is presented to any nurse in recognition of an outstanding commitment to human rights and exemplifying the essence of nursing's philosophy of humanity, to further their work.

A selection panel, made up of members of the editorial board of the *Nursing Ethics* journal, review all nominations for the Human Rights Award annually.

## Criteria for the Human Rights and Nursing Award

1. The contributions of the nominee have influenced health care and/or nursing practice
2. The contributions and accomplishments of the nominee should be worthy of international recognition in the field of human rights

## Nominations

Nominations can be made by anyone and at any time, with or without the knowledge of the nominee. The deadline for submissions for the 2021 awards is **Wednesday, 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021**

Two Awards are given each year.

Nominations should contain the following information:

- The name and contact details of the nominee
- The reasons for making the nomination, i.e. specific achievements in the field of human rights by the nominee
- Two supporting statements from friends or working colleagues of the nominee
- Name and contact details of the person making the nomination, and relationship to the nominee

The nominee will be contacted by the human rights and nursing award coordinator in due course. The nominee will be expected to travel to the conference organised by ICE and held yearly in different locations. The travel and accommodation costs are covered by the Award. The nominees will also receive a personal cheque, the amount of which may vary.
