**Keira Pratt-Boyden** is a qualitative health researcher and medical anthropologist by background. Her thesis (2022) explored mental health service survivors' rejection of and response to the biomedical mental health system through activism, mutual support and indeterminate ways of being. She will use this research to reflect on stubborn and important questions about polyphonic perspectives in knowledge production.

**Hannah Mortimer** has a background in socio-cultural anthropology, archaeology and sociology. She is a postgraduate researcher based in the Centre for Rural Policy Research (CRPR). Her PhD involves ethnographic fieldwork on livestock farms in Devon, investigating the feeding of, and caring for, beef cattle within regenerative systems.
